



Quarterly ECONOMIC SURVEY REPORT

Bedfordshire Chamber of Commerce Quarterly Economic Survey (QES) forms part of the British Chamber of Commerce's national survey and is the principal business survey in the UK. Its results are closely watched by both the Bank of England's Monetary Policy Committee and the Treasury. The data reveals a timely and accurate snapshot for the economic climate for businesses in Bedfordshire and beyond.

Our latest results have been published and the outcome for Q3 2023 saw a contraction across all indicators with:

- Domestic sales and forward orders declining on the previous quarter with only 29% of respondents seeing an overall increase in sales for the period and 20% seeing advanced orders improve for the following quarter
- Export sales also declined with only 27% of local companies seeing an increase
- 84% of firms looking to recruit in quarter 3 experienced difficulties finding the right people
- Cashflow for local businesses declined with 26% of respondents seeing an improvement in the period.
- Companies were under pressure to raise prices due to labour cost increases, energy prices and the cost of raw materials.

The Bottom Line

Responding to the findings, Director General of the British Chambers of Commerce, Shevaun Haviland, said:

"Our research shows that business confidence has stabilised at much healthier levels following a rocky end to 2022. But the economic warning lights are still flashing.

"Firms are increasingly worried about interest rates, and while inflation concerns are falling, persistent wage pressures show we need a greater focus on relieving the UK's tight labour market.

"With manufacturing lagging behind services, and low rates of investment across the board, especially in the hospitality sector, it is clear more needs to be done to spur growth.

"After the disappointment of HS2, firms want to see clear signals from Government to encourage investment. This means putting in place a five-year rolling guarantee on the full expensing tax allowance to give business some much needed certainty."

Upgrading Luton Hoo to Put Town and County on the Map

For Surinder Arora, Founder and Chairman of Arora Group, the project to upgrade and improve Luton Hoo – the hotel, golf, and spa complex with a stunning 18th century manor house at its heart – is much more than business as usual.

It all started with a day trip by his son and grandchildren to Whipsnade Zoo, on the way back from which they took a detour via the Hoo. A few hours later, Surinder received a call: "Dad, you've got to see this place..."

And his son had it right. Because driving through the gates for the first time a short while later, Surinder told us he felt something that, even with his vast experience in the property and hotel sector, he'd never felt before – an immediate sense that the place was, as he puts it, "very special". And so he bought it – as seen.

We had the good fortune to speak to Surinder about his plans for Luton Hoo recently, and what emerges is his determination not only to turn the venue into a world-class destination, but, in so doing, to put Luton and Bedfordshire on the map – whilst also giving something back to its local communities.





Upgrading but conserving

Surinder is no stranger to the business of creating stunning venues and locations. High-end property and hotel developments are his stock-in-trade, and the Arora Group counts the InterContinental London, Crowne Plaza London Heathrow, and the World Business Centre Complex in its portfolio, along with many others.

However, Surinder is clear that the emphasis for Luton Hoo is on upgrading, not expanding. He wants to make every part of what's there already worthy of global repute, but he also wants to conserve what's unique about it.

His vision for the hotel, for example, is that it should not only attain, but exceed, the standard of the luxury Fairmont brand (there are only four such hotels in the UK, and 12 in Europe – and Surinder aims for Luton Hoo to be the best of them).

He's also planning to upgrade the golf course to make it fit to host the 2032 Ryder Cup (he's bidding for this at the moment) – an event that attracts 600 million TV viewers globally.

But at the same time, Surinder's also working closely with Historic England and Central Bedfordshire Council to minimise changes to the manor house (only the bathrooms are in scope), and the 1,100 acres of grounds landscaped by the legendary Lancelot "Capability" Brown.

Much improved spa and conference facilities, upgrades to the wedding venue, and restoration of the lake to its former glory through dredging and de-silting are, equally, all part of the plan to help Luton Hoo work its magic at the top table of world hotel destinations.

And for Surinder, this is indeed almost a spiritual calling. "I feel blessed," he says, "that my company has become the custodian of such an amazing property."

Uplifting the town and its youth

Surinder notes that Luton is a Tier 1 town in the Government's levelling up policy, and he sees great potential for the Luton Hoo plans to deliver real benefit back into local communities – as his earlier projects in the Crawley and Gatwick areas did.

"I'm proposing to treble the number of employees at Luton Hoo, which will obviously be helpful to the local economy" he says, "but I want to go beyond that, and focus on making the place somewhere where young people in particular can gain experience, develop their skills, and further their ambitions."

To this end, he envisages involving local youth organisations in the development and running of the site. The lake, for example, is a prime asset for the local Sea Scouts and Sea Cadets, and one they could benefit from helping to manage.

The upgrades to the golf facilities will also include the founding of a golf academy to support and promote young sporting talent in the area.

Even the hotel itself will be, in Surinder's own words, "kid-friendly"!



Planning and permission underway

Surinder's plans for Luton Hoo are extensive and ambitious, and because of the site's Grade 1 Listed status, may require additional approval from the Secretary of State.

But at a local level, planning permission for the golf course has been approved, and the site's potential contribution to the Government's levelling-up objectives bodes well for a rubber stamp from Westminster.

In Surinder's own words: "Our acquisition of Luton Hoo Hotel, Golf and Spa was always with the intention to curate a luxury leisure and hospitality experience on the estate. We want to continue building on the already rich history of Luton Hoo and to ensure that any future investment into the premises will bring economic benefit to Bedfordshire and surrounding areas."

From a venue that had been for sale for a good couple of years, to one poised to redefine what a luxury hotel destination means, Luton Hoo is about to enter an exciting new chapter in its 250-year history.





East West Rail (EWR) is a once in a generation opportunity to connect people and businesses in Bedfordshire with the thriving centres of Milton Keynes, Cambridge and Oxford. At the heart of EWR is a commitment to community, ensuring the new railway connects the people who live along the route to the things that matter, whilst unlocking the social and economic potential of the area. Here, we shine a light on the investment and opportunities Bedford can expect from the project.

Throughout history, new transport links have led to inward investment, growth, innovation and employment. From the lasting commercial impact of the historic Silk Road trade routes to the more recent reinvention of east London's Docklands following the introduction of the Docklands Light Railway and the Elizabeth Line, new connectivity has attracted investment and unlocked economic growth time and again.

These lessons should not be forgotten when considering the prospects of economic rejuvenation for Bedford. East West Rail (EWR) will by its very nature bring investment to the town, most notably through two modern and accessible stations, including a new station serving Bedford Hospital and a multi-million pound make-over of the Bedford Midland station, supporting the wider regeneration of the town centre.

But terms like 'regeneration' can sometimes be hard to visualise. In the early phases of development – and the Bedford-Cambridge leg of EWR is very much in the formative planning stages – ideas of inward investment tend not to be tangible. But here in Bedfordshire we don't have to look too far; EWR is being developed in three stages, so there are already glimpses elsewhere along the route of the potential opportunities for Bedford.

Bletchley's 'brighter future' – a sign of things to come?

Passenger services between Oxford and Bletchley are expected to start towards the end of 2025. Most of the track has been laid and its construction is well under budget. This has coincided with £23 million plans to regenerate Bletchley – centred around the Brunel shopping centre – with the prospect of direct rail links to Oxford and Cambridge seen by the MK Citizen as providing the 'biggest boost' to the town.

EWR will bring new gateways to the town, with east-west rail links interchanging with north-south rail links to London (much like Bedford). EWR is also bringing a new station entrance and a transport interchange with new links to the town centre. Combined with its plans to revamp the town centre, this will revitalise Bletchley's sense of place, attract investment and create new jobs.

Opportunities for Bedford

EWR means people in Bedford will have access to faster and more reliable east-west public transport. Today, journeys between Bedford and Cambridge take 50 to 75 minutes by road and two hours by train. EWR will cut this to just 35 minutes, which will make Bedford more attractive for business investment and job creation.

These faster, more frequent and more reliable transport links – combined with new and refurbished stations and improved access to the town centre – present the opportunity. The investment and opportunity underway in Bletchley give us the chance to visualise it.

Local Luton businesswoman Ruth Robb, CEO of Azalea and qualified social worker, has won the Gold Award for Charity Champion in the Best Businesswomen Awards for 2023.

Ruth co-founded local Luton Christian charity Azalea in 2007 as part of a small team of volunteers working out of a church in Hightown, Luton to reach out to all those trapped in sex trafficking, primarily in Bedfordshire. For the last 15 years, she has led the organisation to grow significantly from nothing to a turnover of over £450,000 last year. She is well known to a wide range of local partners, including the Luton Borough Council, London Luton Airport and the Bedfordshire PCC, for tackling the local issues surrounding sex trafficking.

Azalea now employs nine full-time equivalent staff and over 80 volunteers. The charity has a 365-degree approach to tackling sex trafficking child sexual abuse, child sexual exploitation, and adult, domestic and international sex trafficking. An early emphasis has been to tackle the demand, which is done through the successful Flint programme for male sex buyers. This strategy now reaches the core dysfunctions and solutions to eradicating domestic and international sex trafficking.

Through Ruth's commitment and dedication, the Azalea model has since developed into a national and international model, with a particular emphasis on Burundi, Greece, Hong Kong, Russia and South Africa.

Some of the use cases included Al-powered student grade prediction for educators and students to anticipate performance trends, generative Al in crafting student reports, streamlining the report-writing process, and hyper-personalised learning, which adapts to individual student needs, fostering more engaging and efficient learning environments.

In addition to its educational impact, Fliweel.tech aims to streamline back-office functions in organisations across many other sectors. Some back-office use cases included:

- Conversational chatbots, employed in online and internal support functions, to offer real-time assistance and connected to internal systems (e.g. HR, IT, or Finance) to reduce time and cost in responding to frequent requests.

The competition was part of the institution's involvement in the national Pathways4Recovery initiative, which aims to provide economically inactive and unemployed individuals with the opportunity to pursue their entrepreneurial ambitions by removing financial barriers.



Held on the University's Luton campus by the Research & Innovation Service (RIS), a group of entrepreneurs were given the opportunity to share their business ideas and practice their pitching skills in front of a panel of judges that included Mohammad Azam, Senior Lecturer and MBA Portfolio Lead at the University – and industry experts such as Debbie Lewis, Regional Ecosystem Manager for NatWest Business.

This event is just one of the ways that the University is dedicated to supporting start-ups and businesses through RIS. Bedfordshire was recently recognised for its entrepreneurial achievements, ranking first in a study of the UK's most entrepreneurial universities.

Championing Trees for Climate

As a catalyst for change, the Forest of Marston Vale Trust has been planting trees and championing the creation of new woodland and green spaces for over twenty-five years.

The Forest vision is rooted in positively exploiting the incredible power and versatility of trees and woodlands to deliver environmentally-led regeneration; attracting inward investment, providing opportunities for leisure and employment, and engendering a sense of place and a pride in those who live and work within the Forest - all while providing the significant landscape, biodiversity, wellbeing, and quality of life benefits the creation of the Forest brings.

Working with local communities, the private and public sector, over two million trees have already been planted, growing tree cover from just 3.6% when the Forest was designated to well over 15% today. Along the way, a dozen publicly accessible community woodlands have been created, and every £1 invested in the creation of the Forest has returned £11 worth of environmental, social and economic benefits to the local area.

Last winter projects delivered through the Trust created nearly 120 hectares of new tree planting. This incredible achievement for the Trust's Forest Creation Team was an area three and half times larger than had ever been planted in a single season before and equates to over 150,000 trees and nearly 7km of hedgerow. This year's planting season is already underway, with an even more ambitious target of 200 hectares.

This boost in planting has been made possible by Trees for Climate, a multi-million pound woodland creation programme, developed by England's Community Forests and funded by Defra through the Government's Nature for Climate Fund. As an expert advisor, trusted delivery partner and funder in one local organisation, the Forest of Marston Vale Trust is able to help landowners and community groups enhance their land through woodland creation. The Trust takes a flexible approach to support and funding, listening to landowners and working with them to assess potential planting ideas and help develop schemes that will fit with their business and environmental objectives.

The Trust also has a strong history of forging mutually rewarding partnerships with local businesses. As companies become more conscious than ever of their environmental impact, an increasing number are discovering the opportunities working with the Trust can bring, and how supporting the Forest can directly benefit their own environmental ambitions.

Ultimately, creating the Forest of Marston Vale isn't only about transforming the landscape, it's also boosting the local economy, growing a new sense of place in communities and helping set the scene for future growth and prosperity; transforming perceptions and prospects, and making life better for people, for wildlife and for the planet.

An acquired brain injury (ABI) can happen to anyone at any time. The effects can be life changing. Our clients have a range of backgrounds and life experiences but what connects them is their brain injury and enjoyment in coming to Headway Luton.

Earlier this year, we were awarded a small grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund administered by Luton Council. Over the course of 10 weeks, clients with the support of professional artists Mary Hearne and Kym Wilson-Huxley, created a large map of Luton focusing on Luton's hat making and brewery industries.

Each client created their own mini hat or beer mat which represented parts of Luton that were meaningful to them. Sandra used to work in Olney Hats in Luton and gave us advice on materials and decoration. Millie is a scientist with great attention to detail and led the making of the woven hats. Steve is a great LTFC fan and made sure the club was represented in the works. Richard is a local historian and helped with the research. Our final piece is available to view at Luton Central Library by the stairs. Come on by, take a look and see what you can spot!



After completing her Masters Degree, Baljit moved to Bedford in 1999 and worked as a consultant pharmacist for high street pharmacies.

Recognising a need to provide pharmacy and health services for people isolated and unable to access local healthcare within Bedford, Baljit set up Smarta Healthcare with her husband Harjinder in 2015 at Priory Business Park. It has grown to include a health clinic offering a range of services from travel vaccinations to corporate employee health and wellbeing services.
